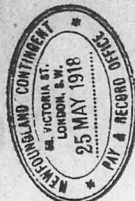

Sir At 8.45 pm on the 17.1.17 I was on duty on the Strand. I saw the accused outside Jacques ~~Hotel~~ Wine Lodge. He was drunk & creating a disturbance. In company with P.C. E. 269, I used every endeavor to persuade the accused to go away quietly but he persistently refused. At the corner of the Strand & Bedford St we took him into custody.
