

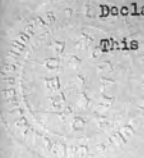

While at Clarumville last week I was interviewed by Mr. Cor. C. Driscoll a resident of that Place. but formerly of St Johns Mr. C. Driscoll. asked me if I would call on you on my return and state his circumstances to you as he has two sons in his Magistrate forces Leo F. C. Driscoll No 1561 serving in the Regiment having joined some three years ago and Richard H. in the American Navy Mr. C. Driscoll some time ago applied for the Separated allowance and certain Papers was filled in by him and forwarded to your Department Mr. C. Driscoll was under the impression that that was all was required and he would receive the allowance in due time but up to the Present he have not received it and this is why he asked me to interview you in speaking in Mr. C. Driscoll's behalf. I may say that I know him for a number of years and also his condition he was employed by the kind of a section foreman for a number of years and while attending his duty he contracted a severe chill from which he never recovered. he spent

Several months in hospital at Quebec. Where he was sent by the President of the Reid & Co. but as his case was incurable he returned to Reid and was given 20th light work in the Machine Shop. This work he did for some five years having to go to work on crutches as he was paralyzed in both legs about four years ago he became very ill and lost all the use of his legs and had to give up work. altogether the Reid Co. out of consideration of the valuable services he had rendered the company gave him a piece of ground at Clarendon and builded a small house for him there and Mr. O'Driscoll removed there and took to repairing shoes for his living. he had three children boys whose were employed as clerks in the city but at the out break of the war. Two of them volunteered as already stated the other being too young. So what remained with his Parents later going to the united states where he is now. 
