I have the honour to state that the late Private Arthur John Abbott, of the 1st Newfoundland Regt., was buried, with full military honours, at Wandsworth Cemetery on the 5/5/17.

The firing and bugle party consisted of men from the 3rd Training Reserve Battalion, Wimbledon.

The Service was taken by the Rev. J. Lewis, Wandsworth.

The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag.

Private Abbott was interred in grave No. 766 of the Newfoundland plot.

A wreath of red roses and laurel leaves was sent by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association, which bore the following inscription:

"In sincere admiration and regret for a good
"soldier who fought the good fight for his
"Country's sake and died in Her services."

Amongst others who attended was E.R. Morris, Esq.; and Corporal R.W. Martin represented the Pay & Record Office.

The Last Post was sounded, and a volley of three rounds blank was fired at 3.30 p.m.

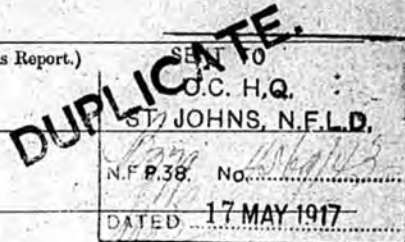

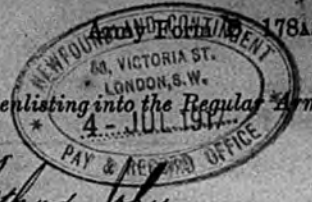
