This cheque is in payment for the balance of the estate of his late son, #1069, Pte. Israel Anderson.


It is about two years since this cheque was issued, and no doubt it will be a bit of a proposition to find out who cashed the cheque, but if you will get in touch with the Manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia, Channel, possibly he may be able to throw some light on the matter, or possibly you may be able to identify the endorsement on the back of the cheque. At any rate Mr. Joseph Anderson states he did not receive it, and it is obvious that it is not similar to his signature, so evidently some unauthorized person got hold of this cheque and cashed it.

If you can throw any light on the matter as to who the guilty party is, it shall be greatly appreciated.

I want to inform you about the money of my son which was going to my son which was killed July 1st.. 1916, and his body was found 23rd. of April 1917. I want to know where the money went, his weekly pay I mean, and I want to find out where it went. now please let me know or I will get further information about it. I think it is enough to give the life of my son, and then you or some other individual is trying to keep my son's money. I want to know where that money went. I am going to fool no longer with you people, and I have a letter here saying that the estate of your late son was paid out to Joseph Anderson on December 28th. but I never got any money from any Department, and I want to know where or how was that money sent to me. I never received that money. Mrs. Jessie Anderson received a check on 10th. January 1919, and never got any money since, and you never said if it is finished or not. Please notify me .

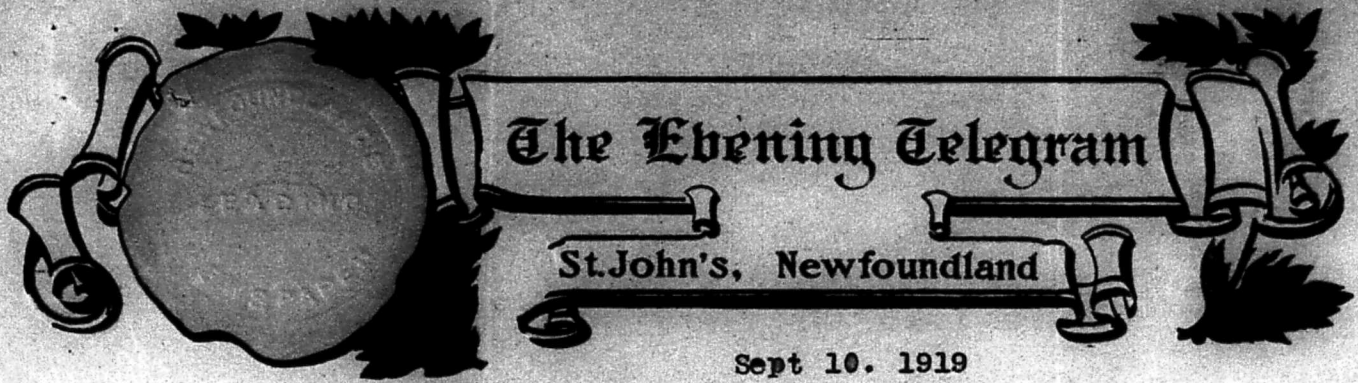

Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 10th inst., with reference to the payments which have been made to parents of #1069 Private Israel Anderson, deceased.

Upon enquiry into this case I find that an allotment of Sixty Cents (60¢) per day was continued payable to the mother, Jessie Anderson, from April 23rd. 1917, - the date of Pte. Anderson's decease, - to Dec. 31st 1918, when said allotment was discontinued by the Pensions Board.

With regard to the question of Pension I am forwarding you herewith copy of letter written Mr. Joseph Anderson by the Board of Pensions Commissioners on Jan. 23rd., 1919, in answer to his application for pension.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 10th inst. with reference to the payments to parents of No.1069 Private Israel Anderson, deceased.

Upon enquiring into this case, I find that an allotment of sixty cents (60¢) per day was continued payable to the mother, Jessie Anderson, from April 23rd, 1917, the date of Pte. Anderson's decease, to Dec. 31st, 1918, when said allotment was discontinued by the Pensions Board.

Dear Sir,

For some time past the Imperial Government have been making enquiries in relation to those men of the First Newfoundland Regiment who have been reported missing since the action of the 1st July. I very much regret to state, however, that from the correspondence which has taken place, a copy of which I enclose, it is evident that none of them are Prisoners of War in Germany, and the authorities are, therefore, reluctantly forced to the conclusion that all these gallant men, whose names are given in the enclosed list, and one of whom was very dear to you, were killed in that fateful action on the 1st of July.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that he, for whom you now mourn, willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honor, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won, and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.
