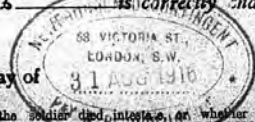

When a man is apprehended by, or surrenders himself to, the Civil Power as an absentee without leave, or as a deserter, if the information tendered leaves no doubt in the mind of the magistrate that the prisoner belongs to one of the Corps mentioned in column 1, the descriptive return should be forwarded as indicated in column 2, provided that the station of the Corps is known.

In the following cases the Descriptive Return should be sent direct to the Secretary, War Office, London, S.W., viz:—

1. When the prisoner appears to be an absentee without leave, or a deserter, from any Corps other than those above mentioned;
2. When it appears, from the evidence, that the prisoner has deserted before joining his unit, or is, in other words, an absconded recruit;
3. When the station of the unit concerned is not known, or is doubtful;
4. When, from any other cause whatever, there is a doubt as to the manner in which a prisoner should be disposed of.

Instructions for the Officer Commanding.

1. If the prisoner herein described appears to be a deserter or absentee without leave, as stated, and sufficient evidence of his identity is available, the Commanding Officer will despatch an escort to remove the man to his Corps. One of the blank routes supplied for the purpose will be filled in for this service, and will be taken by the escort.

2. In cases where the man admits the offence and there is documentary evidence as to his desertion, he may be removed, pending instructions from the General Officer Commanding (which should be applied for) as to his being held to serve under Section 73 of the Army Act, notwithstanding that there are no witnesses to identify him.

3. If the prisoner appears to be a recruit who has not joined his Corps, instructions should be applied for from the War Office before sending an escort, this document being at the same time forwarded. It should also be stated if there is any witness as to identity and where stationed. If the recruit absented himself before final approval while awaiting answers to enquiries as to character, which, when received, were unsatisfactory, the course laid down in the Recruiting Regulations should be adopted and the Magistrate should be informed. (*This paragraph does not apply to Special Reserve Recruits.*)

4. If it appears that the prisoner is not an absentee without leave, or a deserter from the Corps specified, the Magistrate or the Governor of the Prison, as the case may be, should be so informed, the latter being at the same time requested to release the man from custody.

5. Should there be any difficulty in dealing with the case as directed above, this document should be sent to the General Officer Commanding, who, if necessary, should transmit it to the War Office for instructions, with a report of the circumstances, and his recommendation thereon: otherwise it should not be transmitted to that Department.

* In remand cases the Escort should attend at the Court (not at the Prison) on the morning of the day of remand.



This I assume will mean reconsideration of means of repatriation.

The next direct sailing so far advised is the "Tabasco" 3/8/15, possibly she also has not steerage accommodation; in any case the date is too far ahead, and expenses as to subsistence will meanwhile be entailed.

I understand that the Canadians are repatriating practically weekly, including unfit cases, and it is suggested that Anderson and the other men might be included. This means would furnish the advantages of an escort, but to a Canadian port only, after that passages would have to be arranged to St. John's, N.F., and I do not at present know if this could be effectively carried out, having regard to the circumstances, besides the extra expense.

This man has applied for favour of discharge on this side, and it is likely the C.O. will consent.

Two other passages will be required, if available, on the "Tabasco," and will be glad if you will make the necessary arrangements for accommodation.

It appears very inadvisable to send men home for discharge via a Canadian port.

I instructed Sergt. Marshall, with the result as reflected in copy of his report attached, which has been sent to Mr.Benson.

This for your information for what value it may be.

Noted. His case has been dealt with by the civil court in Edinburgh.
