

STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

1847, Cpl. Joseph Babstock,

Salvage Bay.

Enlisted - September 1915, Proceeded Overseas - October 1915

Date & Place of Capture - Masnieres, December 3rd, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - On the morning of the German Counter-attack they bombarded us with Trebuch mortars and Field Guns and levelled our trenches and killed or wounded nearly all the men in our sector of the trench. I was wounded in the arm. The Germans came up in force and surrounded our post, which consisted of two men and myself and my rifle was blown clean out of my hands by a shell which struck the side of the trench and buried us in. When we extricated ourselves the Germans were in our trench and we were taken prisoners.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - I was sent to Gourdroi for 2 days, and then to Le Quesnoy for 2 days, and then I was shifted to Minden in Germany. I stayed for about two months. On arrival at the camp we were lined up - 1500 all told - and our boots, greatcoats and caps were taken away from us, and we were given wooden clogs to wear. We had nothing to do all while in the camp. Our food consisted of a slice of black bread and some watery soup twice a day. We were then sent to Schneidemuhl from January 30th to April 4th. All the corporals were put in a ~~row~~ hut together and we were forced to go out and do camp fatigues at the point of the bayonet or with a whip. We found we had to do these fatigues for all the Russian and French prisoners as well. When we complained about it we were threatened with horsewhipping and imprisonment for six months. Finally we were shifted to Grosborn where I remained until after the Armistice was signed. The treatment was much better here, and we got our parcels from the Red Cross fairly regularly. We had nothing to do except go and cut wood every fortnight. I was repatriated via Danzig and arrived in Leith on Xmas Day, 1918.
