Dear Sir:

With reference to your letter concerning Mr. Richard Badcock, father of #2314, Pte. Arthur Badcock, I beg to report as follows:

(1) With regard to the father's statement that he has never received any Gratuity money, Pension, or any other payment since his son's decease, I beg to advise that gratuity, as we know it, is not payable on account of men who die in the Service; that pension has not been claimed by Mr. Badcock and that, until such time as he puts forth his claim, it cannot be decided whether he is entitled to a pension or not; and -that the balance due the estate of his late son was mailed him on or about the 12th. December 1917.

(2) With regard to your statement, that the Separation Allowance ceased at the time of his death, I am not aware that Separation Allowance was paid on this man's account. He left an allotment of his pay, amounting to 70¢ per day, payable to his father, and this was continued to the father until November 1919.

(3) His late son's Pay-Book has not come to hand, nor any other of his effects.

(4) Up to the present writing, there is no record here of the location of his late son's grave. It is quite possible, however, that same may be received at any time from Lt. Col. Mangle, who has the matter in hand. If the grave has been located, photograph of it will be available later on; how soon it is impossible to state.
