

It was with great regret that the Government received a cablegram from the Record Office, London, intimating that your son, Private Henry H. Baldwin, who had previously been reported wounded and missing ~~on October 12th, 1916,~~ had now been reported killed in action on that date.

Permit me to express on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your dear son early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellowcountrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did to the utmost of his ability to bring about such result.

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th instant, respecting No. 1523, Private Henry H. Baldwin, and in reply beg to say that, according to the official records in this Department, this man was reported on January 3rd as having been wounded on October 12th/16, whilst a further notification, received on January 11th, stated that he was then reported wounded and missing on October 12th. It is possible that the item in the issue of CANADA of the 13th January, to which you refer, has reference to the first of the official reports above quoted. It is probable that the report which was received here on the 11th January was not included in the issue of CANADA of the 13th of the same month. In the absence of any official information to the contrary I fear that we must consider that of the 11th January as authentic.

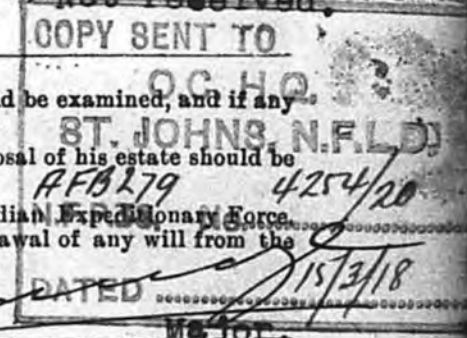

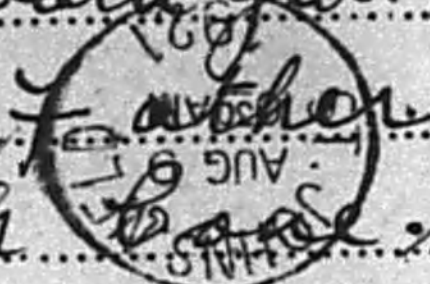
