

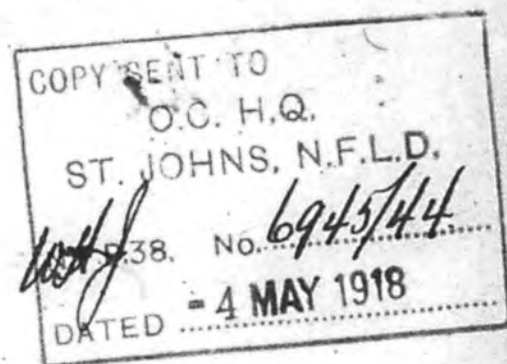

You may rest assured that our representatives in Lachen will do their best for your boy as well as the rest of the Newbonglang Regiment.
