In reply to your letter dated the 10th instant, your Reference No. 1839, I beg to inform you that additional pension in a case such as that to which you refer would not be payable under the Provisions of the Pension Act, the relative section of which is quoted for your information as follows:

Sec. 23 (2) "No pension shall be paid to or in respect of a child unless such child was acknowledged and maintained by a member of the forces in respect of whom a pension is claimed at the time of the appearance of the injury or disease which caused the disability for which he is pensioned or which resulted in his death; provided, however, that a legitimate child born subsequent to the appearance of such injury or disease shall be entitled to a pension. Provided also that the Commission may, in its discretion, award a pension to or in respect of any child entitled in the opinion of the Commission to be maintained by the member of the forces in respect of whom pension is claimed."

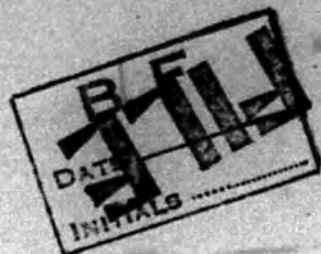

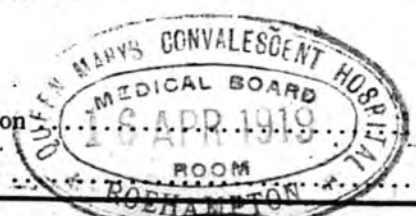


