Received, in apparent good order and condition for shipment on board the British Steamship, having liberty to call at any port or ports, whether in or out of the port of discharge, without the same being deemed a deviation, w/cargo, mails, and/or passengers, and/or for any other purpose, at St. John, N.E., and with liberty to lighter the goods shipped packages, said to contain merchandise as hereinafter specified. of packages are unknown:—

NOTE.—The plain copies of Bills of Lading for goods consigned to "ORDER," must state the name and address of the consignee, and must state the name and address of the shipper, and must state the name and address of the destination, and must state the name and address of the consignee at destination who are to be notified of arrival; any expenses incurred in consequence of failure to supply will be for account of the owners of the goods.

Open 1 Deal Kit

If and so long as the ship is insured against War Risks' Insurance Association, under or in connection with a War Risks' Insurance Scheme of his Majesty's Government, the ship, in addition to any liberties expressed or implied in the Bill of Lading, shall have liberty to comply with any orders or directions as to departure, arrival, routes, ports of call, stoppages, or otherwise howsoever given by his Majesty's Government or any Department thereof, or any person acting or purporting to act with the authority of his Majesty or his Majesty's Government, or any Department thereof, or by any Committee or person acting under the terms of the War Risks' Insurance on the ship, or in pursuance of any such orders or directions, and nothing shall prevent the ship from complying with any such orders or directions.

and the said goods and/or packages, subject to the condition that the consignees in the like apparent good order and condition of the goods, and that the goods may safely get and always lie afloat, as per Bill of Lading.

The following are the exceptions and stipulations above referred to and conditions of the contract:

- That the master, owners or agents of the vessel or its connections, as God, the King's enemies, pirates, robbers, thieves by land or sea, whether seizure, or embargo, adverse claims, restraints of princes and rulers or prohibition thereof, whether the owners be parties thereto or not, the act or otherwise, bursting of packages or consequences arising therefrom, sea stowage or contact with, or smell or evaporation from any other goods, or said ship, or from their stails, inaccuracies in, obliteration, insufficiency, or the packages and the description thereof in this bill of lading (the alleged) tion, delay, lightering to or from the vessel, transshipment, landing, jettison, seas, rivers, and navigation, boilers, machinery or appurtenances, strains, defect therein or damage thereto), collision, stranding, heeling over, upset for the purpose of extinguishing fire or for any other purpose, unseaworthy owners to provide against such unseaworthiness), and all faults or errors above mentioned, or the loss, damage, or injury arising therefrom be occupiers, mariners, engineers, stevedores, workmen, or other persons in the service, sets they would otherwise be liable, or otherwise howsoever.
- That general average and charges may, in the ship's option, be added to shipowners shall have exercised due diligence to make the Steamer in all respects, or disaster, resulting from accident, or fault or errors in navigation, or in unseaworthiness, whether existing at the time of shipment or at the time of shipment, consignees or owners of the cargo, shall, nevertheless, pay salvage payment of any sacrifices, losses or expenses of a general average nature and effect, and to the same extent, as if such accident, danger, damage or defect or any latent or other defect or unseaworthiness.
- That the steamer, or substituted steamer, has liberty to make deviation from her course, or to be towed, to carry goods of all kinds, and putting back or into any port, or otherwise being prevented from any call or in any other manner which the shipowner shall think fit.
- That the master, owners or agents of the vessel are at liberty at a whatsoever with the whole or part of the cargo shipped hereunder on board or other steamer or steamers, either belonging to the same line or to other than at intermediate ports, and/or to tranship and/or land and/or store merchant's risk, it being understood that all claims for loss or damage caused what, in lighters, barges or elsewhere at any time, or in any place before the goods. Goods which are not admitted into the deposits at which the lighters, or sent to private depots at consignee's risk and expense. The Point Levi, Quebec or Montreal at St. John's, N.E., Halifax, St. John, N water at ship's expense but at the risk of the owners of the goods, it contained. Goods for Montreal may be delivered at Point St. Charles, if sent forward by rail are deliverable at the railway station nearest to the shipper's risk. Goods are to be stowed under the main deck or between the master porter or receiver of cargo to the different lots, and consignees; one consignee, the consignees shall jointly and severally bear any expense the steamer may decide.
- That the master, owners, or agents of the vessel, or its connections, at articles, glass, articles contained in glass, articles of a fragile or perishable watches, clocks, timepieces, mosaics, bills, bank notes of any country, ord statuary, silks, furs, lace, or cashmere, manufactured or unmanufactured, goods of whatever description, beyond the amount of £2 per cubic foot, at invoice price of the goods, unless shipment be made upon a special order agreed upon by the consignees. Parcels for different consignees, collected and made up, shall be packed in separate parcels, and the weight of the parcels shall be ascertained by the master, owners or agents of the vessel or its connections at the risk and expense of the owners of the goods, or retain them on board the goods. In case of the blockade or interdiction of the port of discharge, or if quarantine, war, or disturbances (whether existing or only anticipated), or risk of the owners of the goods. The ship's responsibility shall cease when shall thereupon become payable and be paid; and the steamer shall have a discharge hereunder.
- That freight on live stock is payable on the number shipped, with connection shall not be responsible for the death of or injury to the stock, or otherwise, shall be recoverable in general average, but shall be borne by the owners or consignees of the goods, and shall constitute a lien on the cargo for the freight until paid, or if such freight shall be payable by cargo or abatement, and freight payable by consignees of goods for Newfoundland be delivered. Full freight is due on damaged or unsound goods and on goods but if the goods be made deliverable hereunder to a named consignee, or if discharge the carrier, although the consignee may not be legally entitled to charges thereon, but for all previously manifested freights and charges due average, the consignee shall, before receiving delivery order for the goods, the average expenses as they may require, and they shall have a lien on the freight and charges, the steamer shall be entitled to recover the deficiency if may incur or suffer on account of the incorrect or insufficient marking of the required by the authorities at the port of loading or discharge, or the fallow may be required, and the owners or agents of the vessel shall have a lien up by sale or otherwise. Dear Sir:-

Re Lieut. C.S. Frost

In regard to the case of Lieut. Frost, respecting whom I am sending an Official communication under another cover may I suggest to you that, if this officer's disability is sufficiently serious to warrant reasonable ground for believing that he will be unfit to resume active service, it might be better to direct him to come to St. John's and undergo his next examination; because in such a case, if held to be unfit, he would be discharged given his pension, and return at once to his civil employment which was that of a bank clerk. If he goes back to Ayr he will probably be there for some time, then boarded, went back via Quebec, the I.C.R. and the Reid railway to St. John's, and boarded again, and this will probably cause us an outlay of four or five hundred dollars, whereas if he were brought here direct from Yarmouth it would only mean about \$50 altogether for his passage and board for a day or two, until discharged.

Of course I do not know what ~~about~~ the nature of his injuries is and therefore cannot say whether this course would be the proper one, but I know you will give due consideration to the suggestion in the light of your knowledge of the details of his case.

Re Second Lieut. Frank Bennett.

We had this officer's papers before us at a Pension Board meeting last night and decided to pass them through Major Carty to you for his discharge, or, rather, transfer to the reserve of officers, which I understand is the official procedure of such cases, as he has been held by the doctors to be permanently unfit.

During the discussion of his case, Major Carty told us that Mr. Bennett, who is thus far on furlough, called to see him two or three days ago and asked him if he could put him on light duty, and Major Carty says he stated he could not do this as the doctors had held him to be permanently unfit and recommended his discharge; but it is apparent from this that this young man would naturally like to keep on nominal service and draw \$140 a month, instead of being discharged, more especially as Dr. Fraser states that the aggravation of his disability by active service is not sufficiently great to justify any pension or allowance. I would say, however, that my remarks in regard to Lieut. Carter's case apply in this instance also, but with even greater force, because whereas Carter was on active service and wounded, Bennett was never out of England, and seeing that we have already discharged Lieut. Lumsden, who was wounded with the Canadians, Lieut. Burn-Knight who was ~~in~~ the first of July fight; and Lieut. Burnham who though he did not go beyond Ayr, claimed to be only support of a widowed mother, it would, I think, leave the door open for very vigorous criticism if Lieut. Bennett were continued on duty at the rate of \$1680 a year under these circumstances,

I may add that the members of the Board were unanimous in the opinion that Major Carty had taken the proper step, and that Lieut. Bennett, should be discharged and not retained.

I am embolded to make these suggestions because of your saying in your last note to me regarding the Carter case, that you were pleased that I brought the Carter matter to your notice; and I make the above suggestions in the same spirit.

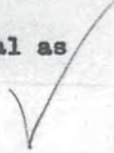
