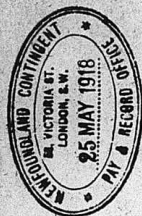

The Reverend Mr. Robins of Hbr. Breton gives me the following data regarding George Bond ex-pte Royal Mfld Regt. of Great Harbor near Hbr. Breton:

" Badly wounded in France April 12<sup>th</sup> 1918; was discharged from Army A.I.; went fishing on arrival home and has continued at this work since; left hip - same side as the wounded side now discharging "

I have been unable to see him and as I am leaving Hbr. Breton I will not be able to see him and there is not a doctor for at least 40 miles on either side of Gr. Hbr.

Personally I think the military authorities should have this man go to St. John's for examination and treatment.

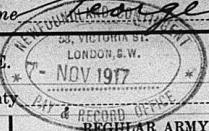
