Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 12th inst. I beg to say that letters for men of the Regiment who are Prisoners of War in Germany, should be addressed in care of the Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, 58 Victoria Street, London, S.W., Private parcels are not allowed to be sent except to officers. The authorities in London have made arrangements for the supply of food and clothing to all Prisoners of War, and sums of money can be remitted by friends through the Pay and Record Office, London, or if the men desire such remittances can be made out of their pay. Such sums must not be in excess of two shillings weekly, per man.

The Newfoundland War Contingent Association in London are giving very special attention to the needs of our Prisoners of War and I think the friends of such men may rest assured that every thing that it is possible to accomplish with a view to their comfort while prisoners will be done by the said Association.
