Pte H. Boone. 992 I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your communication of 21st inst. This man was invalided on account of wounds received whilst on active service and I understand was granted a pension on this account. He was admitted to hospital on account of a recurrence of a venereal disease, originally contracted before he went on active service. He was discharged from hospital here after a short stay, as cured, and when reattested for recruiting, it was on account of his having been invalided on account of wounds received in action, the particulars concerning venereal disease not having been disclosed. I am informed that there has been a recurrence of this disease, and in consequence, arrangements are being made to dispose of his services.

I am desired by the Board to call your attention to the fact that Private ~~Wool~~ Boone, suffering for some time past from syphilis, a venereal disease, has been re-attested for Recruiting purposes, and to observe that this man has been confined more than once in the institution on Military Road for treatment for this disease; that he has occasioned substantial expense because help has had to be provided for his dependents who are in need; and that the Board respectfully represents that there is an element of danger to other people in allowing a man affected with this disease to be going about the country on a recruiting mission.

The only explanation I can give of the matter is that, when we notified Mrs. Boone on the 11th of January, we acted on a telegram which had just been received. Our news is official and authentic. In the case of the War Contingent Association they probably would receive the news by mail and also forward their letter to Mrs. Boone by mail - that is, the news when they receive it would be somewhat old and it would be another three weeks older before it reached Mrs. Boone. The War Contingent Association are taking great interest in our boys and they are seeking to help in every way, but, in regard to notifications, those from this office are certainly to be relied upon, while the letters from the Association are more in the way of letters of sympathy and encouragement.

With the information available to me the above is the only explanation I can give but I think it represents the true state of affairs.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th instant respecting No. 992, Private Nathan Boone, and would say that, up to the present time, his case has not been officially reported to this Department. Cases of a serious nature, whether caused by wounds or illness, are reported from the Dardanelles by cable to the Record Office in London, and thence by cable to His Excellency the Governor by whom the information is then transmitted to this Department for the necessary action. Other cases, which could not be classified as dangerous or serious, are notified by mail. It may be that the present case is one of the latter, in which event information will no doubt be forthcoming within a few days. In accordance with your request, I have to-day wired the mother of Private Boone and informed her that no official intimation has been received respecting her son's case, but that enquiries will be made and that she will be notified should any information be supplied by the Record Office in London.

I can appreciate the anxiety and suspense which the parents of our boys must suffer, and I can assure you that the Government are always ready and anxious to do whatever may be possible to obtain the fullest information available respecting each case and to communicate the same to the next of kin without unnecessary delay.

Writing from 58 Victoria St, Westminster, London, on Novem. 2nd last Henry Reeve (the Hon. Sec.) informed them that Private Nathan Boone has been admitted to the Hospital at Malta. The letter did not state the nature of the case but gave the impression that the Soldier was ill & not wounded.

Naturally the parents of the lad are very anxious to learn something of their boy. Can you tell them anything? It seems strange that the parents have not been officially notified and that the name of Nathan Boone has not appeared in any published Casualty list. Probably I think his reported illness is slight but his march to the Hospital at Malta, surely his name & the nature of his incapacity should have been officially received and his parents informed. I feel sure ^{that} you can understand the anxiety of the lad's family & their desire for news, you will simply make inquiries and send along word either by telegram or letter to soon as you know anything definite of him.
