The origin and cause of Tubercular Pleurisy or of Pulmonary Tuberculosis is the Tubercle Bacilliss. Any other causes mentioned are only contributory and matter little in dealing with the man.

That the man was accepted as fit for Active Service is presumptive evidence that he had no Tuberculosis. Both causes mentioned, viz. "Kick from a horse" and "Exposure" are only contributory causes.

Would you please say if arrangements have been made, as requested by the A. A. G., Military District No. 6 for this man to receive pay?

The troops are now quartered at the Armouries pending transportation. I have further to report that Capt. Martin and his officers showed us every attention and kindness and that the accommodation on the ship was very comfortable and food of excellent quality and quantity. The service was first class and much credit is due to the Chief Steward, Mr. Jones, and his staff for the manner in which they looked after the comforts of the men. I have not received any information as to the exact date of embarkation.




