# Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

# Civil Re-establishment Committee



I HEREBY CERTIFY that I have had an interview with the Vocational Officer of the Civil Re-establishment Committee or other recognized vocational agent of the Committee who has explained to me the provisions made by the Committee for the industrial re-training of disabled or partially disabled sailors and soldiers as well as the readiness of the Committee to assist any returned sailors and soldiers (whether disabled or not) to find employment. My decision is as follows:

This is in reply to your memorandum of April 4th in which you ask for a report on the above maned case.

Hr. Hiffott served with the Reyal Houfoundland Regiment from May 1918 antil August 1919 in Canada and England only. His medical examination at the time of discharge did not disclose any disabling conditions and his entegory was recorded as A.1. on demobilization.

In view of the fact that this veteran did not see service is a theatre of actual use and as there was so record of any disabling condition at the time of discharge, I regret to state that any application for pension submitted at this time would be subject to the provisions of Section 15 of the Pension Act which reads as follows:-

> "In respect of military service during Norld war I a pension for disability shall not be amaried unless application therefor has been ande before the let day of July, 1986, with respect to a number of the forces who did not serve in a theatre of addunt war."
