

I have the honour to state that the late Lce. Corporal James G. Brown, of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, was buried, with full military honours, at Brookwood Cemetery on the 15/18/17.

The firing and bugle party consisted of men from the 3rd South African Regiment.

The Service was conducted by the Rev. E.G.M. Roberts, C.F.

The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag. Lce. Corporal Brown was buried in Grave No. 180156.

Three wreaths were laid upon the coffin: one of lilies and ferns from the staff and patients of Ward B.8., 3rd London General Hospital; one of lilies and ferns from Mrs Flood, who visited L.Cpl. Brown continually during his illness; and another wreath of laurel leaves and red roses from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.

Amongst those who attended at the graveside were the Rev. G. Day, C.F., who attended the deceased during his illness, besides several of the patients from the 3rd London General Hospital. Cpl. T.M. Hussey represented the Pay & Record Office.

The last post was sounded, and a volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.45 p.m.

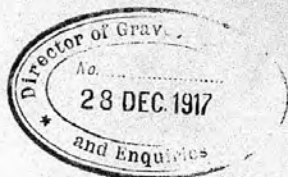

I have the honour to state that the late Lce. Corporal James G. Brown, of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, was buried, with full military honours, at Brookwood Cemetery on the 13/12/17.

The firing and bugle party consisted of men from the 3rd South African Regiment.

The Service was conducted by the Rev. E.G.M. Roberts, C.F.

The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag. Lce. Corporal Brown was buried in Grave No. 180156.

Three wreaths were laid upon the coffin: one of lilies and ferns from the staff and patients of Ward B.A., 3rd London General Hospital; one of lilies and ferns from Mrs Flood, who visited L.Cpl. Brown continually during his illness; and another wreath of laurel leaves and red roses from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.

Amongst those who attended at the graveside were the Rev. G. Day, C.F., who attended the deceased during his illness, besides several of the patients from the 3rd London General Hospital. Cpl. T.M. Russey represented the Pay & Record Office.

The last post was sounded, and a volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.45 p.m.
