NOTES.—(i.) (A) No.1053, the late Pte. P.J. Brown.
Pte. Brown was buried with full military honours
at Wandsworth Cemetery on 22nd July, 1916.

The number of his grave was 764 and was in the
R.C. ground.

Plate on Coffin, which was covered with the New-
foundland flag: " Pte. P.J. Brown,
Died July 18th 1916
Aged 20 years. "

2 Wreaths of white lilies, " in loving sympathy
for bereaved parents and relatives at home. "
3. Miss A.E. Westcott, 3 Knoll Road, Wandsworth,
Lilies and roses.

One of artificial roses in glass case, and one
of white lilies.
6. The Newfoundland War Contingent Association,

The funeral service was conducted by two priests,
and at the close a salute of three rounds was fired by
a detachment of the Rifle Brigade and the Last Post
sounded.

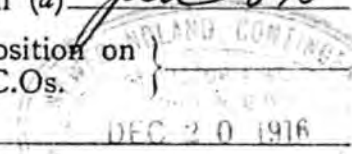

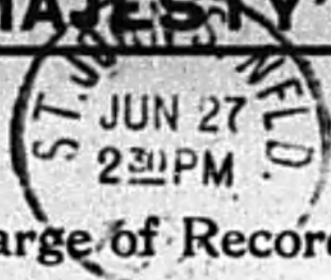

"I much regret the death of poor young Brown who died here yesterday. He will be buried today at Wandsworth. Everything possible was done for him. I am leaving immediately for the front in France to visit the Newfoundland Soldiers and will report fully on my return. I regret exceedingly Mr. Jackson's sudden death. The Colony has lost a patriotic son and St. John's a citizen whose example and work were and will be of great value."
