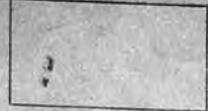

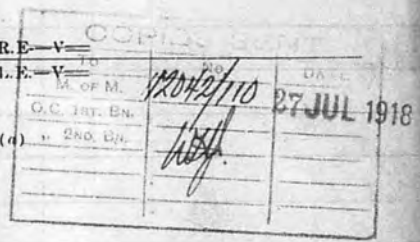

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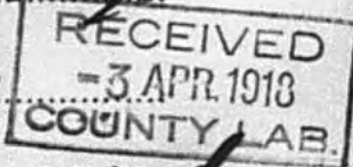

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

As we find it impossible to procure work in this country and also find it impossible to exist any longer under the present circumstances, we have decided with your assistance to migrate to Newfoundland where we feel there is now every chance of getting work as you will no doubt be aware that a new pulp and paper mill is being erected on the Humber River this very likely will give employment to some thousands of men, and we shouldn't like to miss this opportunity.

We shall be very grateful if you would grant us a passage to St. John's preferably the latter part of March or the first week in April as that is about the time operations will most likely start. We also should be glad to have any information which you may be able to furnish us with in connection with the construction of this mill that is perhaps to put us in touch with the Company who purpose operating the mill.

We have every intention in making an honest endeavour to refund the money expended on us by the Government. In conclusion we may state that we and our dependants are presently in pretty bad financial straits hence our reason for approaching you on this matter. Trusting you will give us every encouragement by assisting us as requested.

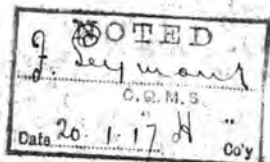

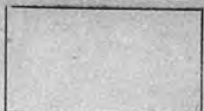


