### INSTRUCTIONS.

1. These forms are to be completed in all cases of accidental or self-inflicted injuries, involving a soldier's absence from duty, whether due to the man's own act, or that of a comrade, or to other extraneous circumstances.

2. Where several casualties occur as the result of one accident, one form is to be completed for each Officer or other rank injured, but only one set of statements from the witnesses of the accident need be attached.

3. Full statements are to be taken by an Officer from the witnesses of the accident. These statements will be signed by the witnesses making them, and by the Officer who takes them, and will be forwarded with this Form. Where it is intended to take disciplinary action, copies of these statements should be retained by the Unit for use in lieu of a summary of evidence.

4. Where it is possible to obtain it, a statement from the injured man will also be forwarded. This, however, should not be used as evidence against him in any subsequent disciplinary proceedings.

#### Special Instructions as to Evidence in Cases of Self-Inflicted Wounds.

5. In these cases the statements mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 above should bring out all material points, *e.g.*, statements to the effect that the witness was with the accused standing on the fire step (or sitting in a dug-out); that the accused was cleaning his rifle; position of safety catch, magazine, etc., if known; muzzle of rifle on toe of foot; hand on muzzle; that accused pulled trigger; that the rifle was afterwards examined and an empty cartridge case was found in chamber; that accused was seen to be wounded; what accused said ("I have shot myself," "I did not know it was loaded," etc.).

6. A soldier is specially trained in the safe use of his rifle and revolver, and evidence of any neglect of the ordinary precautions as to their handling in such cases usually has considerable bearing on the question of negligence. In cases of wilful self-wounding the fullest possible evidence should be obtained; unless the evidence is conclusive this charge should not be used. The charge will therefore usually be laid under sec. 40 Army Act—"Conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline in wounding himself through negligently handling a rifle," and an alternative charge to this effect should be made, even if the accused is to be tried under section 18 for wilful maiming.

### All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your communication of 5th inst.

Regulations provide that all men coming in for enlistment, are to be provided with first class fare and food. I have had an opportunity of personally seeing your son, and going into the matter with him. He tells me that you must have been misinformed, as the statement that the officials of the "Wren" refused to give him any food, is incorrect. He told me that he reached the steamer just after tea, and could have had his tea that evening, but did not feel like eating anything and did not ask for it. He had his breakfast next morning, on the "Wren".

He waited at Clarendville that day, and had his dinner and tea there. He paid for this himself, and the amount is being repaid to him by Regimental Paymaster.

He then caught accommodation train in the evening, arriving at St. John's next morning. He informed me that he had not made any complaint to anyone, and was treated allright.

I informed him that you had written me on the matter and suggested to him that he might write to you, so that you would understand the situation.

I hope that your son will soon have an opportunity to return home in uniform on leave. The manner in which your sons have volunteered for to serve their King and Country, should be an example to many young men in your and other communities throughout the Island, who do not seem to understand that it can only be going out and fighting the foe in Europe, that we can hope to keep him away from our own homes.

On Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> inst my son Cyril W. Rugden having secured a Pass for The Reid N. Co. left Britannia by S. B. Wren for S. Johns, to offer himself as a recruit.

The Pass issued by John Leewood by called for First Class conveyance and meals, and I have been told today that the officials on the Wren refused to give the boy anything to eat with the result that he was from Noon of Saturday until Noon of Sunday when the ship reached Clarenceville, without food.

In behalf of my son and for the correct information of other possible recruits I beg to know the facts

as to fare and food provided to young  
men so travelling.

My son informs me today by telegraph  
that he has successfully passed  
medical examination and has been  
accepted for service in the Army, so  
that being in the City you might learn  
from him personally if the above  
report is correct.

I may further say that I have  
three sons all of whom have offered  
for service, two being accepted and  
I beg to place on record that this  
last boy was my hope for my  
possible helpless and declining  
years.

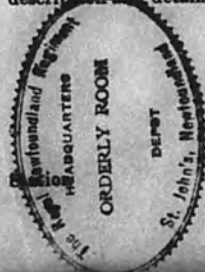
