Dear Mrs. Burbridge:-

Your letter addressed to the Colonial Secretary, the Hon. W. W. Halfyard, regarding the effects of your son #3882 the late Pte. W. Burbridge, has been passed to this Office for attention, and in reply I beg to state that we sent an Official from this Department to call on the lady with whom he boarded, Mrs. Pippy who resides at the corner of ^{Parters} Long's Hill and Young St. St. John's, and she stated that a Kit Bag was sent to the Railway Station, which we sent for and got, and she also gave this N.C.O. a small parcel containing two Souvenir Brookes and some Post-cards, addressed to Mrs. John Harding, Epworth, Burin. A small Valise containing some ~~personal effects~~ property of your son was sent to this Office from the Barracks, so that we are now forwarding on to you one Kit Bag and one Valise containing some personal effects belonging to your son, and also one small parcel addressed to Mrs. John Harding Epworth, Burin, which I trust you will be kind enough to hand to her.

In regard to the Great Coat that you mention, we could not find any trace of that but we presume that as it was Regimental property and not your son's own personal property, it was taken in charge by the Military Authorities and held by them.

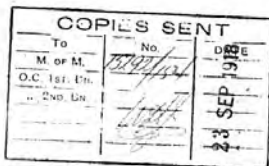
