It is hoped that you may be  
able to substitute another reliable  
N.C.O. to undertake the duties  
previously allocated to Sergt. W.G.  
Roberts.

If possible we wish to avoid  
sending any further men to the  
United Kingdom as the more pressing  
matter at present is to repatriate.

It is hoped that Roberts will  
return at same time as Burt although  
last telegram does not so reveal.

It may be mentioned that the  
Prisoners of War parcels (totalling  
315) have been made up and  
despatched, to the temporary delay  
of other pressing work, and it is  
hoped that results of this impromptu  
arrangement will prove satisfactory,  
having regard to the fact that  
the process requires trained and  
experienced service, which takes  
time to acquire.

You will proceed to the United Kingdom via Montreal leaving St. John's on Thursday October 24th. You will be accompanied by #54 Staff C.M.S. G. Burt, whose services are urgently required by the Chief Paymaster, London.

It has not been found possible to arrange transportation from a Canadian Port to the United Kingdom, you will therefore apply to the Assistant Director of Supplies and Transport, Montreal, for transport accommodation for yourself and Staff C.M.S. Burt. If you should be unable to arrange the necessary accommodation, you will apply to the C.O.C. Military District # 4.

It may not be possible to secure passport immediately on your arrival in Montreal, and you are therefore authorized to contract for yourself and Staff C.M.S. Burt, a reasonable Hotel, charges which will be refunded by the Chief Paymaster when he has satisfied himself that your claim is fair and just.

In event of your being informed by the Competent authorities in Montreal, that accommodation is not possible for a considerable time, you will wire me for instructions.

- "Military, St. Johns, 19/8/18 (1226) to Montreal and endeavoured to get transportation, which was not possible; and arrangements were made for passage on Government Transport sailing from New York, from which port they were expecting to leave on or about November 3rd.
- "Telegraph when SQMS. Burt, Sgt. Roberts may be expected Synoptical."
- "Synoptical, London, 23/9/18 (8305) Ref. your telegram 19th. Sept., "Burt and Roberts will leave by "earliest opportunity." Military."

It is hoped, that if not already en route, they soon will be, as the services of the former, particularly, are required in connection with despatch of periodical issue of clothing to Prisoners of War, shortly due. Also it may be mentioned that ex this Office Staff there are at present 4 in hospital and 4 on "Blue Puttee Leave."

S.Q.M.S. Burt embarked with others on October 24th. The draft of which he was a member proceeded to Montreal and endeavoured to get transportation, which was not possible; and arrangements were made for passage on Government Transport sailing from New York, from which port they were expecting to leave on or about November 3rd.

Sergt. Roberts is still in the City, and will be returning when arrangements can be made for transportation for men now here on furlough, and others.

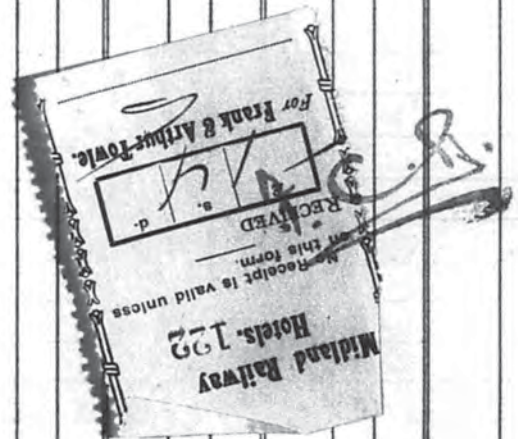



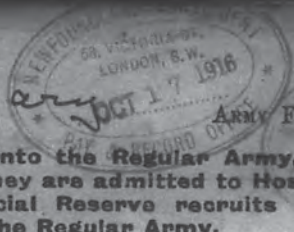
