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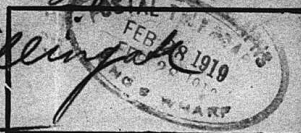

I received a telegram from Magistrate Roberts yesterday with reference to your discharge money etc., and replied to him stating that same had been mailed to you on the ninth of this month. No doubt you will receive same within a day or two. The cheque represents the amount due from the Depot and is for regimental pay to date of your discharge, subsistence allowance for 14 days and clothing allowance for \$60.00.

You must make application to the Department of Militia for certain forms to be filled out in connection with War Service Gratuity and send them to the Paymaster there, who will deal with it.

I enclose herewith cheque for the amount of Fifty Nine Dollars ~~13341~~ and eighty cents (\$59.80), which is the amount of board money due you while awaiting your discharge.

This completes full payments to you on discharge with exception of War Service Gratuity.
