FROM 1ST NEWFOUNDLAND REGIMENT

TO Major Montgomery, Comd

ST. JOHN'S, NFLD.

Aug 10th 1916.

Major A. Montgomery

Sir

I beg to report an incident which occurred yesterday Aug 9th.

Myself in company with Sq. Major A. Murrell & Sgt. Inst. Roseworthy went by the 2:30 P.M. excursion train to Topsail to visit the "C.L.B." camp, having been invited to do so by some of the W.O.s of "C.L.B."

Shortly after leaving St. Johns a gentleman entered the compartment and after abusing a gentleman (I think Mr Harrow Jardine) turned on our party and insulted us especially myself, whom he publicly accused of (swinging the lead) which is slang for malingering. He also made several other false statements regarding the N.F.L.D. Regt. especially all officers & N.C.O.s.

This gentleman, also accused me of having a great pull with the authorities and of having a good time at the

I believe the gentleman in question to be a Magistrate of the Colony. Mr O. Loole. Trusting I have done the right thing in reporting this painful matter to you I am,

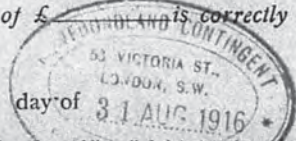

I have to acknowledge receipt of your communication in relation to the report in writing by E. Butcher Sergeant of the Newfoundland Regiment and in reply beg to say that the statement of "abusing a gentleman I think Mr. Harvey Sardinio" is not borne out by the facts which are as follows.

My son was a volunteer in the Newfoundland Regiment having enlisted for 12 months. His period of service however was 19 months when he resigned. Some discussion took place in the train referred in the communication between Mr. Sardinio and my self in relation to my son not re-enlisting.

The natural instincts of a parent were and should be, to defend the actions of his son which I did at heated discussion took place which was participated in by Sergeant Butcher and it is possible that I may have made use of expressions in defence of my son's conduct which I would



not under ordinary circumstances have used. I may say that I did make use of language which reflected upon the Soldierly qualities of Sergeant Butcher as any other non-Commissioned officer, or officer of the Newfoundlaw Regiment. I regret this exceedingly and beg to tender my apologies for so doing. I may further say that all parties concerned looked to the best of friends.
