Can you give me any information about our soldiers that have not yet returned to Newfoundland, I have a brother who has been serving in the Army for one year & 10 months, last April he was wounded in the shoulder & face was in the hospital for several months went through several operations to get a piece of shrapnel removed. When he got well enough to go to France again he was sent but happily for us all the war was over before he was sent to the front. When we heard there were 1000 soldiers coming on Corsica we then thought certainly he would be on her seeing there were some coming that were only gone about half to Long as him, but we were very much disappointed to find he was not among the numbers. & we can't hear where they are at present, or don't know any thing about what time they will be sent home. It's over a month ago since we heard from him. Can you give me any information about what time they will be sent home

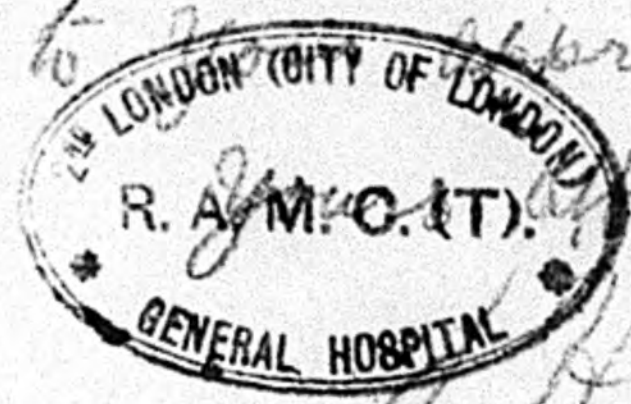
