

7. Officers and men are reminded that it is their duty to give no information of a military nature to anyone whilst they are on leave in England. 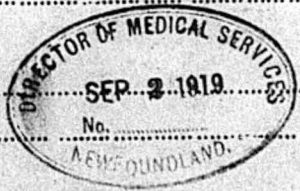

With regard to the application of the sister of Pte. Thomas Cahill, No. 3343 for separation allowance, and in continuation of my conversation with you over the 'phone this morning I beg to make the following statement and explanation.

The applicant is his sister.

She has neither Father nor Mother nor sister, and only this brother Thomas. She is a delicate stockly woman who has never been out to work and has never earned her own living anywhere.

She lives with Thomas in Thomas' house at Carbonear, and he has supported her ever since the Father and Mother died. She keeps house for him.

Last Spring, in April, she came over to St. John's to nurse an aunt of hers at 15 Barnes' Place, and when her aunt recovered she returned to Carbonear.

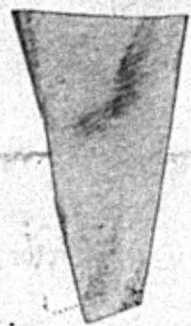

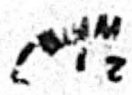
