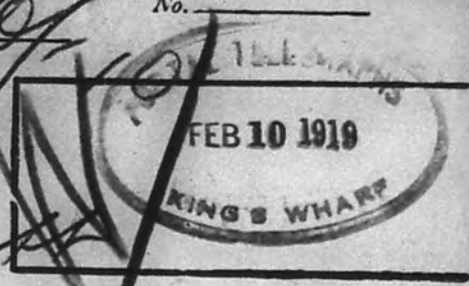



The Record Office, London states that at the time of receipt of the letter from this Dept., L/Cpl. Gaines was a patient at Mile End Military Hospital, Bancroft Road, London; and a copy of our letter was sent to the Officer Commanding that hospital, with a request that he convey contents to L/Cpl. Gaines.

It is hoped that you have been in receipt of letters from him since that date of your telegram in Oct.

L/Cpl. Gaines was discharged from Hospital on 28th Sept. and re-joined the 2nd Battalion on 7th Jan., with which unit he is now serving at Winchester.
