NOTES.—(i.) According to Daily Orders this man was declared a deserter as on 19/6/15. He had an Allotment of 70 cents per day. A request was sent to St. John's to stop payment thereof, which was done as at 30/6/15.

Daily Orders of 2/9/15 state:-
"Forfeits 40 days pay, awarded 28 days F.P."

On his being struck off as a deserter his account was transferred to the non-effective Pay Book, which shows debit balance of £1.16.8.

Having regard to the above facts the following points are submitted for replies:-

1. Since he was regarded as a deserter, does he re-enlist? or
2. Is he nominally taken on again and pay credited as from Pay Period commencing 4/9/15?
3. Is the full amount of the forfeit to be charged against pay &c. accumulated since then?

On 2 Sept. 1915 No 151 Pte J. Caldwell was brought before me on trial as a deserter. Special dispensations permit Commanding Officers to try desertions as simple cases of absence (in order to avoid multiplications of Courts Martial). I therefore proceeded with his trial as an absentee, and there was no evidence except A.F.O. 1618, the A.F.2 (Court of Enquiry) not being forthcoming. I was thus compelled to allow Caldwell to choose between a Court Martial (where evidence could have been brought from abroad, if necessary) and summary jurisdiction. He elected the latter and as the only available evidence proved no more than 40 days absence, he was sentenced to 28 days detention and it was recorded that he had forfeited 40 days pay by Royal Warrant, not having been present to earn it from July 21st to Aug 29. The only stoppages from Caldwell's pay that are justified by record of trial and conviction are:-

July 21 to Aug 29.-- 40 days (Absence)
Aug 30 to Sep 26. 28 days (detention)

The necessary adjustment should, therefore, in my opinion, be made in his accounts, as he is entitled to any benefits due to absence of evidence etc, that may have been allowed to accrue through mismanagement or otherwise. He must therefore be credited with pay until July 20 and from Sept 27th. The man is now a good soldier and goes with the draft which awaits orders to move.

There appears to be in some minds a misunderstanding of the remark "Forfeits
 ---pay under R.W.". This is not an award but a record of an automatic event
 under a provision of the Royal Warrant. A soldier who is absent does not earn his
 pay. Upon his return he is punished or otherwise for absence by receiving
 confinement to Barracks F.P. or detention, and the duration of his absence having
 been determined a "remark" is made "You forfeit --- days pay by R.W.". This "remark"
 is for information only and the substance of it cannot be varied at will by the
 Officer who makes it, as it has been predetermined by the Royal Warrant.

The effect of this in Caldwell's case is that he is
 not to be credited with pay from July 21st to August 29, owing to his absence,
 and that he is to be deprived of his pay from August 30 to Sept. 26, owing to his
 having received an award which carried with it deprivation of pay.

We are anxious to locate John Cadwell, about forty-five years of age, formerly of the 2nd Bn. Newfoundland Regt. (rank, private; regimental number 151). He received his discharge from this regiment in November 1917, in Scotland, and is now said to be in your city.

Cadwell was first married over thirty years ago, when he lived in this city. His first wife left him, going to the United States. About 1900 or 1901 he went through a form of marriage with a woman from one of the neighboring towns, without having, as far as we can ascertain, obtained any legal form of separation from the wife who left him. Two children were born, Hazel, now eleven, and Florence, fifteen. Shortly after this woman's death, he married in March 1911, Lena Jarrett, an Englishwoman who has been most devoted to the two children, and is now trying to support them.

The family was in St. John's at the time of the outbreak of war, and the man enlisted as above. 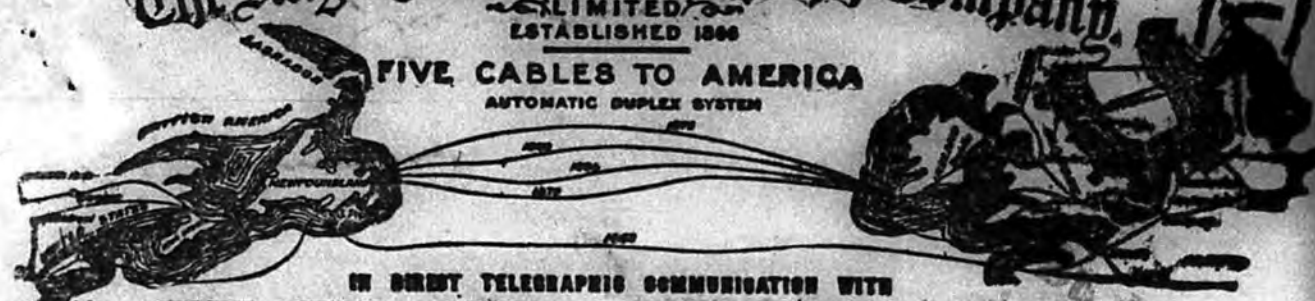
