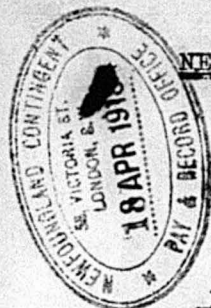



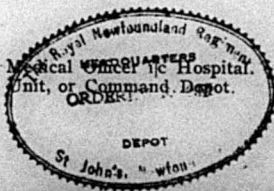

I Michael Campbell of Campbell's Creek, Port au Port, Ex. Pte.
No. 1818, in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, beg to state as follows:-

I enlisted for Service with the Regiment at St. John's, on the 8th day of September 1915, and proceeded Overseas by the S.S. Corsican on November 27th and landed at Devon, England, on the 8th December 1915. Remained in England six months and then proceeded to France and landed at La Havre. A member of A. Company of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. After a two weeks training at Rouen my Company was sent up the line to Ypres, Belgium, about the month of August 1916, while in this sector was wounded in the left arm and went to hospital where I remained six months.

After leaving hospital was sent to the Depot Ayreshire, Scotland where I served four months and was then sent back to France August 1917 and joined the Battalion again at Ypres, where we remained until the battle of Cambrai in which my battalion took part. It was here that I was taken prisoner by the Germans on the 3rd day of Dec. 1917. The circumstances attending my capture were as follows On the 20th day of Nov. 1917 our battalion went over "The Top" in full strength took out objective and held it. In the meantime we were surrounded by the Germans who were gradually closing in upon us and shelled us and during this shell fire I was captured.

After I was taken prisoner was taken to a French village behind the German lines where my wounds were attended to, from thence I was sent to Altdam, Germany. For about 2 months I underwent medical treatment for my wounds and when I was considered fit to work I was sent with eighty three others prisoners to a place called Spandicourt to cut pit props and while here was also engaged working in a saw mill. I was taken prisoner on Dec. 3rd 1917 and released on December ~~1st~~ 16th 1918. During my captivity I cannot say that I was treated very harshly, I like the rest of my fellow prisoners suffered for a scarcity of food. The principle, and I might say the only articles of diet consisted of barley bread, vegetable soup and coffee.

I Michael Campbell of Campbell's Creek,
Port au Port, ex-pte, No-1818, in the Royal Newfoundland
