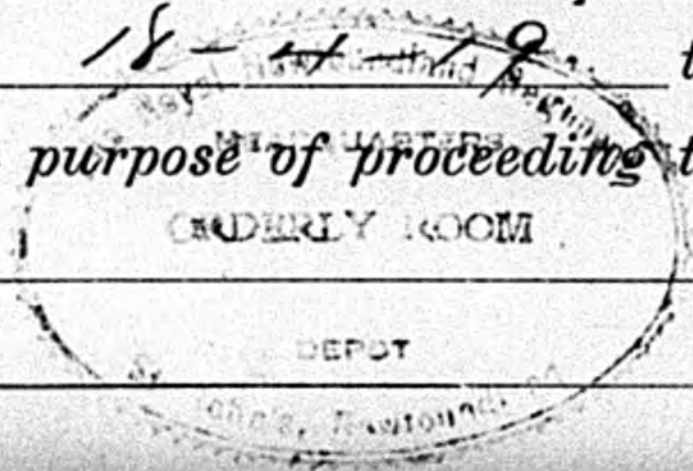

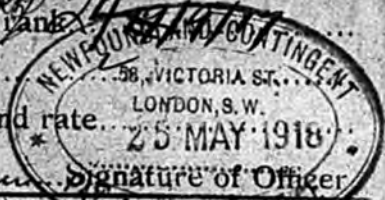

successful trip but it took him a week

to do it owing to the extraordinary ice conditions. He had to get two men to go with him to work the boat.

Now Sir, none of these men are paid for their work up to date.

Mr Roberts ^{sent} a letter with passes of Baravan & wife to the Dept. of Militia immediately on his return early in May charging \$89.00.
