Following letter, which has been acknowledged, has been received and is passed to you for reply, please:

April 15th- 1918.

"Honourable Sir,

"Owing to so many parcels going astray I am sending in o/c you a box and parcel for our boy which is wounded in France. The box I am posting today. The parcel I posted on Easter Monday, it was marked socks the rest was candy. I am thinking that my name the sender his mother was not put on the outside, as I had to get it addressed away from home, if you receive a parcel in his name, marked socks please forward it. We would like very much for our boys to get what we sends them we would only be to glad to send all we could to them if they would get it all right, but we hear that some of them only gets the wrappings of their parcels and some dont get nothing.

Our boy that is now wounded is the youngest of our boys. Our eldest boy has enlisted in the American Navy as he was a citizen, and another in America, that is taking out his Captains papers, and probably will be working for the Allies, as he was last fall bringing food from Seattle to New York for France. Their Father is seventy one 71 years of age, and like myself very proud of our boys but we can ill afford to send things to them if they dont get it. We would go with one meal a day and send the cost of the rest to
