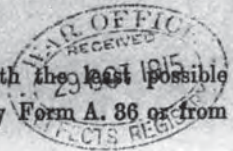





Statements of accounts in both cases were forwarded by this office to H. Q., St. John's 4/9/16, and 5/3/17, respectively and if you will be good enough to apply to the Deputy Paymaster he should be in a position to furnish all available information.

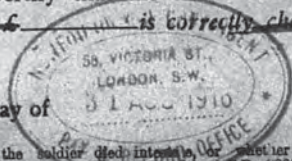
