

Private Thomas Carew is one of four brothers who enlisted in the Newfoundland Regiment. Two have been killed, a third, wounded, is now in France, and the fourth is this Thomas Carew, who appears to be a young man of about 22 years with a wife and children.

His mother, Mrs. Carew, apparently of 2, Brine Street, who urges that she has a crippled husband, and is very distressed at the thought of losing her fourth son, has appealed to know whether there would be any chance of keeping him for the present.

Of course, I do not know what the young man himself may feel, but on the facts as I have

Reference maintenance of Wife.

I am in receipt of a letter from your wife, Mrs. Nora Carew, in which she states that up to the present she has not received any allotment from you, and that she is in urgent need of support.

I am at a loss to understand why this has been overlooked by you, as one of the first duties of a soldier is to see that those depending on him, are provided for.

Under the terms of your enlistment you are amenable and subject to the Rules and Laws of the British Army, and under same you are compelled to make proper provision for anyone who is dependant on you for support.

I have personally interviewed your wife, who is in a delicate state of health, and is now in need of money to buy certain things that are absolutely essential to her.

As you have been married since enlisting your next of kin becomes your wife instead of your father, and it is

only natural to suppose that she should be your first care seeing that according to your enlisting papers you declare that you have nobody at home who is depending on you for their maintenance.

Upon investigation I find that the allotment you have now current is made out in favour of your mother, Mrs. Carrie Carew of 33 Patrick St., and in view of the application of your wife for support I would suggest that you take either of the two following courses in order to provide for her maintenance;-

(a) That unless your mother is in urgent need of the money that you cancel your allotment current in her favour and make a new one in favour of your wife for the Fifty cents (.50¢) per day.

(b) If it is absolutely necessary that your mother receives a certain amount from you, that you cancel the allotment of Fifty cents per day now running in her favour and make two new allotments;- one for thirty cents per day in favour of your mother, and another for fifty cents per day in favour of your wife.

Either of the above is a very fair way of adjusting this matter. If you chose to adopt A. the amount available for yourself is unchanged. If B. the amount available for yourself will be reduced to thirty cents per day. This, however, should not make any difference to you, as it is obvious if you have two persons to support you must be content to do with less yourself, besides which as I have already pointed out, it is your duty, and if you do not do this matter voluntary we shall have to take steps to avail of our authority under Army Laws to allot certain amounts from your pay to provide for their support. This we do not want to do so look to you for immediate answer stating what you intend to do in this matter, and which of the above courses you are going to adopt.

Immediately upon receipt of word from you I shall forward to you the necessary papers for you to sign, so that I can have this matter adjusted without any delay.

In the meantime I have asked the Pay Dept. to hold over your allotment for the month of August until they hear from me.
