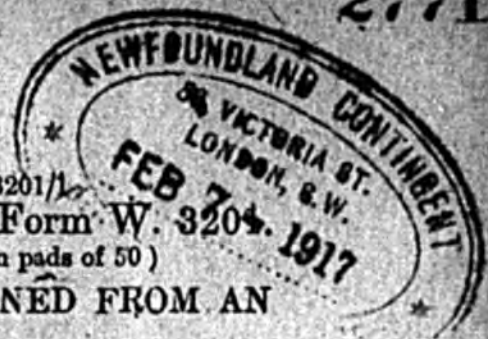

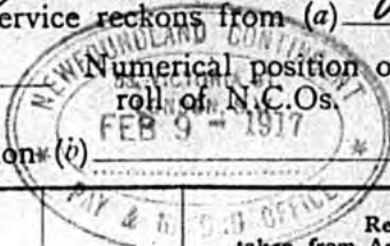

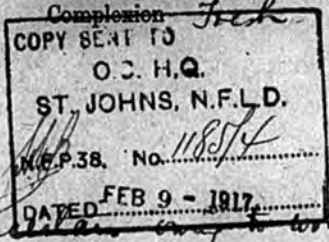

MARCH 28TH, 1917.

Scar about three inches long inner side right arm with loss of bone. Paralysis of hand and wrist due to nerve injury. No ankylosis--Sensation returning.

SEPTEMBER 28TH, 1917

Scar four inches long--inner side right arm--with slight loss of bone--ulnar nerve destroyed causing paralysis of most of the hand, wrist and forearm. Portion of shell in arm yet. No ankylosis at elbow but more or less ankylosis of finger joints. Sensation or hyperplasia rather about the thumb and radial surface of forearm through loss of circulation, co-lateral circulation defective.

JANUARY 9TH, 1918

Colour of hand improved over last report. Position about same. Sensation has returned, but fingers are still stiff, as also wrist.

SEPTEMBER 3RD, 1918

Hand in same condition.

OCTOBER 3RD, 1919.,

Gun shot wound right upper arm. Cannot use hand as fingers are stiff as well as wrist. No improvement since Sept 3rd 1918., Ulnar nerve destroyed causing paralysis of most of hand wrist and forearm. Co-lateral circulation poor.

DECEMBER 3RD, 1919.,

Grasp of right hand feeble. Sensation has improved. Extends hand fully, but flexion practically limited to distant phalangeal joint. Unable to pick up anything.

Above mentioned man who has been discharged from Army as permanently unfit and who was re-attested for Home Defence Duties and latterly employed at Recruiting. He has been recommended by M.C. Depot for treatment at Naval and Military Convalescent Hospital and I enclose herewith correspondence between this office and B.M.S. concerning same.

In conversation with B.M.S. I find that he understands all men re-attested and about to be discharged, must go before a standing Medical Board for determination of their Physical Condition, so that a record may be kept of whether any further disability contracted by Pensionier, is attributable to Military Service or not.
