





with reference to your letter 28/6/19 (4634): relative to alleged loss of Kit the following is the report of the N.C.O. in charge of the Baggage Section:

"The trunk in question was stored in the basement of "54 Victoria Street on August 18th 1918 and was taken "away by Major Carty when leaving for Newfoundland stout the 10th or 11th November 1918. Major Carty had access to the trunk on several occasions and "took articles out and put others in. This is the "first indication I have had that various articles "were missing from the trunk in question. I am "certain that Major Carty did not call my attention to the fact that the trunk had been opened and "various articles extracted. I cannot give any "explanation whatever.

S.Q.M.S. Piggott also stated that the keys of your trunk were kept in your possession and that you were the only person who had access to it. Assuming that you locked it each time after removing articles you required, you made no mention of any damage having been incurred through it being tampered with while in this office. There is, therefore, no evidence that it was.

It is much regretted that owing to the tim which has elapsed since the date of the alleged loss, there is no possibility of obtaining any evidence as to the actual loss or the cause. If you had reported it at the time the matter could have been investigated by the police who would possibly have been able to trace the missing articles. All reasonable precautions were taken to safeguard the personal effects of






