My dear Major Parsons,

I received a telegram today to effect "report dentist Bay of Islands for treatment this message will be authority signed Pension Commissioners". I went to S^t. Johns about the last of July to have a tooth extracted, as my mouth was in very bad shape, I went to Dr. Howlett and before extracting tooth I had to take pills for three or four days to corrode the blood as I am a bleeder Dr. Howlett then informed me that I should have all my teeth extracted and about the shortest time it would take would be from three to four weeks, as he would have to take them one by one. I could not remain in town as I had to be in S^t. George's for the Circuit Court, I reported the matter to Major Knight and he told me to get a report from Dr. Howlett which is in your office, Major Knight sent me up for a board consisting of Dr. Frazer and Paterson after which I was



notified to go before Dr McPherson and O'Reilly which I did. Major Knight told me he would bring the case under your notice and I was under the impression that I would be called into town for treatment. I have always had trouble with bleeding when having an extraction. In Malta they had great difficulty in stopping the bleeding. In London at Wandsworth they put me to sleep. Dr Howlett understands my condition and I am sure he would sooner see me go to Corner Brook than to him as it is not a nice job getting my teeth out. Dr Perkins has his office at Corner Brook and if I have to go there and put in a month as a guest of Glynmill Inn at \$6⁰⁰ per day with medical attendance, I don't think the Commissioners will economise much on me. I prefer to go to St John's where I know that I will have proper attention and care and not a Hotel. I would therefore



request you to have the matter of Corner-
Brook reconsidered
