Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Dear Mr. Gibbs,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 21st ult., in reference to 374 Pte. J. Gaul of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

Upon looking up the record of this soldier I find that he received a gunshot wound in the shoulder on July 1st 1916. At present he is in France but I feel pretty sure that his work there is not of a character that would bring him into the firing line: he is probably employed at the base if he is classed "B2". However, as you suggest, I will take up his case and see if furlough cannot be obtained for him.

As you are aware, I endeavoured on all occasions to obtain the fullest consideration for the men who formed the first battalion and who went to Egypt and Gallipoli, and afterwards to France, and who are still fighting there. They are entitled to, and should receive, a rest after such a long and trying experience. This would be obtained without difficulty if we had the reinforcements we should have to take their places. However, I shall be glad to bring the case of Pte. Gaul to the notice of the commanding Officer of the 1st Battalion and request that, if his services can be at all spared, he be given an opportunity to come home to see his people and have a chance to recuperate which, no doubt, he so badly needs.

I write you on behalf of John Caul, 374, Private in the Newfoundland Regiment. You will see from his Official number that he is one of the first 500. Caul was at Gallipoli and has been in almost continuous service ever since, and was wounded in the July Drive.

He has been examined by the Doctoes several times and is classed "B 2" which means discharged or Home Service. While on furlough in January past, which was for ten days, he wrote his relatives intimating his physical unfitness for active service, and asked if something could not be done considering the time of active service he has given. It is really a pity that so few of the first five hundred being left, something could not be done to give men of Caul's type a chance to recuperate, while others not half so deserving have, for some reason or another, managed to secure concessions. You will understand that I do not insinuate anything in this respect, so far as you or your position is concerned.
