Dear Sir:

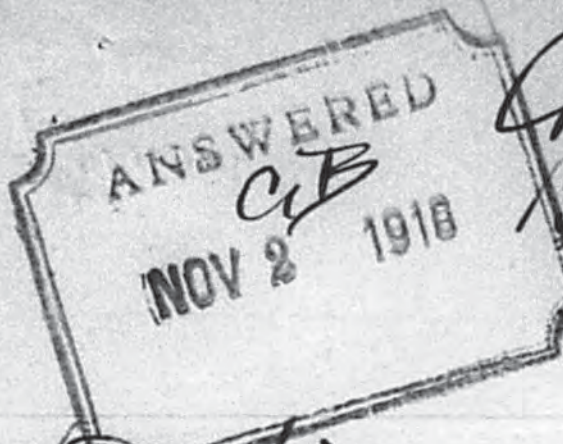
