I beg to inform you that, in accordance with the recommendation of a Medical Board held on the man marginally named, at Bulford Camp on December 2nd., he was returned to Canada as medically unfit for further service on the 14th instant and sailed from Avonmouth per steamer "PRINCIPELLO", the necessary arrangements for his transportation being previously arranged by me on request of the A.D.M.S.

As Private Channing is a member of the Newfoundland Contingent, it would not appear that the cost of his return transport to Canada should be borne by the Canadian Government, but rather by your Government.

Will you, therefore, please arrange for a refund of the passage money, viz: £6-10-0, being credited to this Office.



I have the honour to acknowledge your favor of 9th. inst.,

As far as the position here is concerned, your full allottment was paid up to January 7th, the date of your discharge. With regard to other amounts due you, we had no record of this matter and until we heard from the authorities on the other side, could not do anything. We wrote them and up to the time of my leaving here in charge of the 2nd. Contingent, had not received a reply.

There are several errors in your letter which must be corrected. When your mother called up yesterday morning I did not profess absolute ignorance of the affair but told her that as I had been away for over 2 months in charge of the 2nd. Contingent and had just returned, I could not say what position the matter was in, as Mr. Bursell had been acting as pay-master. I told her furthermore that I would see him immediately and ascertain if he had received any word. 

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

INSTRUCTIONS—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.

This section should be completed in the Hospital at which a man is attending at the time of his examination by a Medical Board, or, if the man is not in Hospital, by the Medical Officer of the Unit or Command Depot. The Soldier should be given a full opportunity of examining it, as, if awarded a pension, his subsequent identification depends on his confirming this declaration. The "Rank," "Station," and "Date" should be in his own handwriting.

The form will then be attached to the Proceedings of the man's Medical Board and will be forwarded to the O. iIc Records together with the remainder of the man's documents.
