Dear Sir:-

In relation to our conversation a day or two ago on the subject of your son, Lieut. Max Churchill's retirement from the Regiment.

I may say that I have looked up his papers in the department and find that he was before the Medical Board in November of last year and his disability was put down for "three months owing to some heart trouble". On March last he was again before the Medical Board and upon the certificate of the full Board he was put down as "Permanently Unfit owing to the same trouble" He was therefore retired. This certificate is signed by four Doctors of the Pensions & Disabilities Medical Board.

I merely state the above facts for your information, and it will be for you to decide as to any further steps that you may feel disposed to take in relation thereto.

Your reference 19th. June. I return Mr. Churchill's application.

I did not consider it advisable to place same before the Standing Committee as no aspect of his case, has as yet, been submitted to them. The technical position is that Mr. Churchill having been found unfit for Military Service by the Medical Board, was retired and placed on the Reserve of Officers. In order to satisfy the authorities I would consider that his case would have to be reviewed by the Medical Board again.

If Mr. Churchill were found fit for General Service being on the Reserve of Officers there should ordinarily be no objection to his resuming Active duty again, unless other considerations were a factor. This would necessitate an explanation being made to Mr. Churchill. The position offers difficulties as from confidential reports it is evident that as an officer he was not a credit to the Regiment. He was not on Active ^{Service} as an officer and his conduct at Ayr was the

subject of confidential report by the O.C. 2nd. Battalion.

The position might be put before Mr. Churchill by means of a personal interview with Your Excellency if you consider it desirable.

(2) 2nd Lieut E. Churchill
tendered an explanation regarding the
irregularity in reference to the Company's
accounts. I am not in possession of the
full facts and cannot arrive at a fair

delet his name thereon. But he admitted

-ledge and anxiety, and that the money has
not been misappropriated and is in order.
He promises amendment.

(3) Sergeant Lieutenant M. Churchill

enlisted at the first call to arms (M. Churchill's
regimental number is 4 which speaks well for
his readiness to serve), and taking into con-
-sideration that both had clean sheets and
received their decorations through the various

grades, while in active service, until they were
selected for Commissions, and accepting
their assurances that in future there would
be no further cause for censure,
I have severely reprimanded them
and wish for the best.

They are now discharging their duties
at the Depot at Headquarters and
should be noted to go with the next
draft, I wish that they were themselves
to be good officers on the field of battle.

Your reference 19th. June. I return Mr. Churchill's application.

I did not consider it advisable to place same before the Standing Committee as no aspect of his case, has as yet, been submitted to them. The technical position is that Mr. Churchill having been found unfit for Military Service by the Medical Board, was retired and placed on the Reserve of Officers. In order to satisfy the authorities I would consider that his case would have to be reviewed by the Medical Board again.

If Mr. Churchill were found fit for General Service being on the Reserve of Officers there should ordinarily be no objection to his resuming Active duty again, unless other considerations were a factor. This would necessitate an explanation being made to Mr. Churchill. The position offers difficulties as from confidential reports it is evident that as an officer he was not a credit to the Regiment. He was not on Active ^{Service} as an officer and his conduct at Ayr was the

subject of confidential report by the O.C. 2nd. Battalion.

The position might be put before Mr. Churchill by means of a personal interview with Your Excellency if you consider it desirable.




