I beg to draw your attention to the case of the above mentioned man. He was wounded on 23rd August 1917, Fractured left Femur, leg amputated on 7th February, 1920. He therefore has been under treatment in this country for 3 years, and during this period separated from his friends. His present condition suggests the fact he will not be ready for an artificial limb for at least six months, and even this date is very indefinite and might easily be much longer. I therefore suggest he be allowed an extended period of repatriation furlough, to enable him to join his relations; and then should there be no method by which he could be provided with his artificial limb locally, that he be returned to this country for admission to the Limbless Hospital, Roehampton.

He is fretting very much at the long and apparently indefinite period of separation from his home interests and I think would progress more rapidly to convalescence by such a change.

He requires a small daily dressing, but otherwise gets about on crutches with considerable activity.
