Dear Sir:-

I beg to quote hereunder the details of the deed for which your son No. 3642 Private John Clarke was awarded the MILITARY MEDAL, Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Taken from supplement to the LONDON GAZETTE.

"On October 1st, 1916 near LEDEGHEM, Private Clarke acted as guide for a convoy of pack cobs taking ammunition to the forward area. All approaches were heavily shelled and machine gunner by the enemy. Private Clark with great presence of mind and the utmost gallantry first went forward and reconnoitred the best route. The night was intensely dark, but he succeeded in bringing up his own cob and in guiding the rest of the convoy to the forward dump. He brought this convoy without casualties. He thus showed great gallantry and devotion to duty getting ammunition to the front line when it was badly needed.

Please accept my congratulations and assurance of the appreciation of the splendid conduct of your son

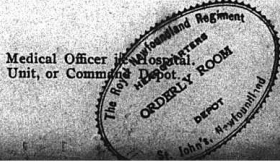
