Dear Sir,

It was with extreme regret that the Government received the news from the Record Office, London, that your son, Private George Rankin Clarke, had died of dysentery on the 24th November. The Government desire to express their sincerest sympathy with you at this time. We feel the passing of our loved ones but it is somewhat of a comfort to think that they have given their lives for the great principles of Righteousness, Justice and Liberty, and that, through their death, we hope that these vital principles will be again established upon this earth.

Your gallant son early obeyed the call of King and Country and never looked back but bravely faced the foe and bore his part manfully. Any country might well be proud to have such loyal and brave young men and such noble and unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Although your gallant lad has laid down his armour he has won the soldier's crown of Victory. His name is added to those which are inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and he will be held in grateful memory by all his fellow-countrymen.
