I have your communication of 18th. inst. relative to this man.

He was attached to the Pay & Record Office as an orderly, and in June last sustained an accident, which laid him off duty.

He did not require Hospital treatment and was attended in billets by the Medical Officer for two or three weeks, after which he reported for medical treatment at the Armoury.

At the time the inquiry came from the D/Paymaster he had been given a week's sick leave on the recommendation of the Medical Officer.

Owing to his being attached to the Record Office he was not on the regular parade sheet at the Armoury, and being away the Adjutant evidently could not locate him.

The soldier is now on duty here.

His board bill will be in order provided that it covers the period following the last payment shown in our records, namely, July 27th.


