Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

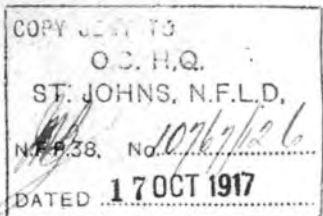

It is presumed that these awards were granted under a misapprehension, since the granting of Pension, Gratuity or Allowance in the case of a Newfoundland soldier rests entirely with the Pensions & Disabilities Board in Newfoundland where Soldiers no longer fit for service are sent for discharge.

It may be necessary to add that when a Soldier comes before a Medical Board and is recommended for discharge from the service, the usual procedure is:-

1. A.F. B.179 to be sent to this office in duplicate.
2. The Soldier, if fit to travel, is discharged from Hospital and ordered to report here.
3. Arrangements are made by this office for his repatriation to Newfoundland where he is finally boarded with a view to assessing the amount of Pension or Gratuity issuable.



Dear Sir:-

I beg to call your attention to a very great injustice which has been done one of my two sons who took part in the battle of July 1st, both of whom were wounded. After spending 3 months in Hospital, and discharged he was marked four months unfit for Foreign Service, during which time he received information from the Pay and Record Office, that his furlough and passage was all arranged for home, but through some mistake another Private by the same name came in his place.

This Boy has been with the Regiment since its formation and left here with "A" Company and is a Gallipoli Veteran, and was never absent from the ranks until wounded on July 1st. Sir, I think the Government should grant me this favour considering that my four sons enlisted. Two who are at present convalescent at Ayr, one who was invalided home last April and lost his health, and the other who was "Unfit".

I am now in poor health and under the Doctors care and my earnest wish is to see my Boy before he leaves for France. I feel confident, Sir, that one word from you or His Excellency would bring him home, even if it is only for a short time and I knew that you will use your influence with His Excellency the Governor, to grant me this request. I know of Boys who have been with the Regiment only a short while and who have only been in France to get home, and not near as deserving furlough as My Boy, who has not, I am sure got one black mark against him.

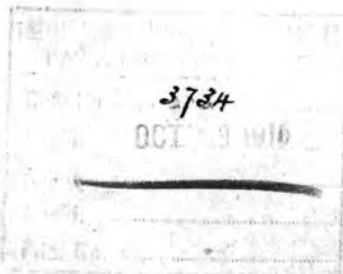
