Sir:-

With reference to your telephone communication to the Assistant Adjutant this morning, re the case of 5188 Pte. Ronald Colbert, whose death occurred yesterday, and the circumstances attending the sending of certain telegrams to his father, I should like to state as follows:-

- (1) I received no intimation of any kind whatsoever concerning the matter until I arrived at the Barracks at 9 a.m. to-day.
- (2) About 2 p.m. yesterday, Major Macpherson, D. M. S., rang up and asked for the Officer on duty. Lieut. Churchill answered and according to his statement was instructed by the D. M. S. to send a telegram to Mr. Colbert, Red Head Cove, to the effect that the latter's son was dangerously ill in hospital, which Lieut. Churchill did on his own responsibility and without reference either to the Adjutant or to myself. He presumed, I take it, that he had received a direct order from the D. M. S.
- (3) About 6.30 p.m. the D. M. S. rang up again and asked for the Officer on duty,—this time Captain Pippy. The D. M. S. stated that Pte. Colbert had died in hospital from Pneumonia and that he had prev-

iously notified the Orderly Room of Colbert's dangerous condition and asked whether Colbert's people had been notified by the Depot. Captain Pippy found out, by reference to the telegraph pad, that a message had been sent by Lieut. Churchill, and this officer states that he understood from the D. M. S. that he wished a notification of the man's death to be sent to his people as well.

Captain Pippy sent the telegram to that effect. He was senior Officer in Barracks at the time and thought that it was desirable, under the circumstances, to send the message without delay. I was not referred to in any way by any of the above-named Officers, and naturally expected that all matters of this kind would pass through the Orderly Room in the usual manner and be brought to my notice. This was not done.

I have given orders, however, to prevent the recurrence of happenings of a similar nature.
