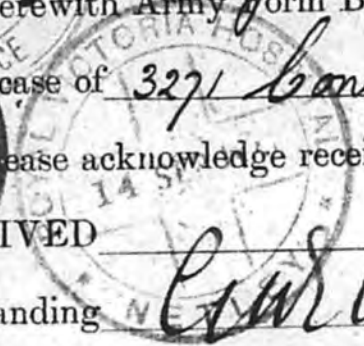

Reference your memorandum (7034) regarding the above-named man: it was owing to the following statement made by your office on 9/7/18 that it was thought advisable not to move him at the present time.

"In reply to your memo of 4th inst., I have to say that 3271 Pte. J. Connors, is not at present fit to travel without special supervision. I await your further instructions, please."

Perhaps I had better explain that it is extremely difficult in the case of Newfoundlanders, to repatriate men who are suffering from unsound minds. To begin with, guarantees have to be given to the shipping company, and repatriation cases very often have to go long railway journeys in the United States, Canada and Newfoundland, sometimes lasting for days, without medical supervision. The O.C. 2nd Bn. R. Newfoundland Regt. does not wish to have Connors retained at his Depot for any length of time, but if you are prepared to state that he (Connors) is fit to proceed to Newfoundland, having regard to the above-mentioned difficulties, that O.C. is willing

(over

to keep him at his Discharge Depot pending an opportunity for repatriation. With your concurrence on that point, therefore, it will be possible to send an escort to Warrington to bring Connors to Winchester.

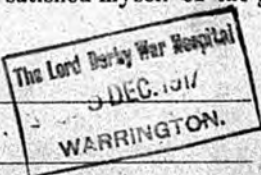

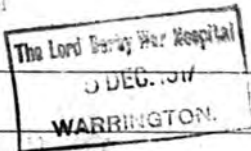
