

Sir,

I desire to place the condition of the above man before you to see if you can help him.

This man is I understand one of the original Newfoundland Contingent and is at present in Ayr. He is married and has one child. He has been drawing out of work donation for some time but I am afraid I will have to refer him to the Court of Referees on the ground that he is incapable of work. He suffers from tuberculosis and he has been sent to the public officer for Health who certifies that the man is so suffering and that he is 100% Disabled and that in his opinion the disease is, if not caused by active service, at least aggravated by it, and that he requires immediate treatment. He is also of the opinion that there is a malarial condition.

The case is causing a good deal of local talk and I think it is only fair that you should be put wise to it. Constantine seems to me to be a deserving case. Sir,

I write you on behalf of No. 563, Pte. Peter Joseph Constantine, Royal Newfoundland Regiment. This soldier reported to the Local War Pensions Committee, but under the Pensions Warrant they were unable to assist him, so he was referred to our Federation for assistance.

This soldier is suffering from consumption which the enclosed certificate will prove. He is to be admitted to Heathfield Sanatorium for treatment, but what is to happen to his wife and child while he is receiving treatment. Now were he not a Colonial soldier he would be entitled to 50/- weekly for himself plus 10/- for his child from the L.W.P.C. here, but as they cannot do so our Federation has granted his wife 20/- weekly to keep her and her child from becoming chargeable to the Poor Law Authorities. What I want to know is (1) will you sanction the Local War Pensions to make allowances to this soldier, the same as if he were one of our own, (2) that you will be responsible for the money issued to him, and refund same to the Local War Pensions Committee and (3) that you will take the Medical Referee's opinion the same as the L.W.P.C. have to do as regards when the man will be put off treatment. I implore on you, Sir, to give this your immediate attention and cable instructions by return either to myself or to Provost Morton who is Chairman of the Pension Committee, or if you would rather leave it in the hands of our Federation we will pay the allowances weekly that you may state to us as a colonial soldier, and you can refund to our Federation. I may also state that before you receive this, there will be another child to keep. This is one of the worst cases that we have had to deal with, and is causing a good deal of commotion in town, and as your Regiment was always known for its generosity, I trust that it will extend to this case, as his trouble is directly caused by his war service. Thanking you in anticipation of an early reply by cable so as this distressed case can be relieved at once.

I have the honour to bring to your notice particulars of a claim for assistance that has been received at this office in respect of Mr. Peter Joseph Constantine, a native of Newfoundland, and formerly No. 563 of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

It will be observed from the attached correspondence that the above named is in a Sanitorium in Ayr and is lying in a critical condition suffering from tuberculosis. As the correspondence will show, he has been assisted by the Federation of Discharged Sailors and Soldiers for the Ayr District and temporary relief has been sent from this office to the extent of £5. (five pounds).

Mr Constantine has a wife and two children to keep and his prospects seem to be well nigh hopeless as from the Doctor's Certificate, original enclosed herewith, he is apparently in a very dangerous condition.

I have requested the Chief Staff Officer in London to cable to the Minister of Militia with a view to ascertaining if the above named is eligible for pension in consideration of the fact that, according to the Medical Report, his disability is entirely attributable to his War Service.

Mr. Constantine was demobilized on the 15th February, 1919, and it is not known whether he made a claim at that time in respect of his disability, but whether he did so or not there is no doubt that at the present he and his family are in great distress, and I would be glad to be instructed as to what assistance should be provided.

Sir,

I write you on behalf of No. 563 Pte. Peter Joseph Constantine, Royal Newfoundland Regiment. This soldier reported to the Local War Pensions Committee, but under the Pensions Warrant they were unable to assist him, so he was referred to our Federation for assistance.

This soldier is suffering from consumption which the enclosed certificate will prove. He is to be admitted to Heathfield Sanatorium for treatment, but what is to happen to his wife and child while he is receiving treatment. Now were he not a Colonial soldier he would be entitled to 50/- weekly for himself plus 10/- for his child from the L.W.P.C. here, but as they cannot do so our Federation has granted his wife 20/- weekly to keep her and her child from becoming chargeable to the Poor Law Authorities. What I want to know is (1) will you sanction the Local War Pensions to make allowance to this soldier, the same as if he were one of our own, (2) that you will be responsible for the money issued to him, and refund same to the Local War Pensions Committee and (3) that you will take the Medical Referee's opinion the same as the L.W.P.C. have to do as regards when the man will be put off treatment. I implore on you, Sir, to give this your immediate attention and cable instructions by return either to myself or to Provost Morton who is Chairman of the Pension Committee, or if you would rather leave it in the hands of our Federation we will pay the allowances weekly that you may state to us as a colonial soldier, and you can refund to our Federation. I may also state that before you receive this, there will be another child to keep. This is one of the worst cases that we have had to deal with, and is causing a good deal of commotion in town, and as your Regiment was always known for its generosity, I trust that it will extend to this case, as his trouble is directly caused by his War service. Thanking you in anticipation of an early reply by cable so as this distressed case can be relieved at once,

I desire to place the condition of the above man before you to see if you can help him.

This man is I understand one of the original Newfoundland Contingent and is at present in Ayr. He is married and has one child. He has been drawing out of work donation for some time but I am afraid I will have to refer him to the Court of Referees on the ground that he is incapable of work. He suffers from tuberculosis and he has been sent to the public officer for Health who certifies that the man is so suffering and that he is 100% disabled and that in his opinion the disability is, if not caused by active service, at least aggravated by it, and that he requires immediate treatment. He is also of the opinion that there is a malarial condition.

The case is causing a good deal of Local talk and I think it is only fair that you should be put wise to it. Constantine seems to me to be a deserving case. If you desire it and notify me accordingly I can arrange for him to be examined by the Medical Referee for the Ayr Burgh Local War Pension Committee.

Trusting that you will be able to do something for this man as soon as possible.

Reference your letter of the 5/11/19 and my telegram of the 8/11/19 Re No. 563 Peter Constantine, Royal Newfoundland Regiment, I am enclosing Dr's cert showing 100% Disablement. This man joined the Regiment on or about 9/9/14 and was demobilised early in 1919. I understand he made application for pension after he left the Regiment but was never examined. He is married and has one child born on 29/8/18. The man does not desire to go back to Newfoundland and in any case I question if he ever will be fit to go. He is at present in Heathfield Sanitorium and of course his out of work donation has ceased so that his wife and child has no income. I think it is a really deserving case and should be assisted immediately. The address of the nearest Pension Committee is Mr. A.N. Buchanan, Ayr Burgh Local War Pension Committee, Nile Court, Ayr.
