Dear Madam:-

Re. 3382 Pte. A. Whelan & 3423 Pte. T. Corbin.

I beg to quote hereunder the details for which the DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL was awarded to your son #3423 Private Thos. Corbin of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, taken from the supplement to the London Gazette.

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty . On the 14th. October 1918, during the advance from LEDEGHEM towards the LYS when our smoke barrage lifted, the platoon to which these men belonged was being enfiladed by enemy Machine Guns and fired at point blank range. These men immediately opened fire with their Lewis Guns but the tripod of the gun was at once shot away. In order to bring down the enemy Machine Guns which were firing from 80 yards away Private Corbin knelt down and supported the Lewis Gun on his shoulder while Pte. Whelan operated it. Though both men were very much exposed and at very close range, they outgought and killed the enemy Machine Gunners. Both these men's cloths and equipment were perforated with bullets, and though both men were slightly wounded, they refused to leave the Company and carried on throughout the action.

- (b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g., gunshot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

Admissions to the outlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections should render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists (on these Army Forms) direct to the War Office, and to the Colonial Contingent Record Office concerned.

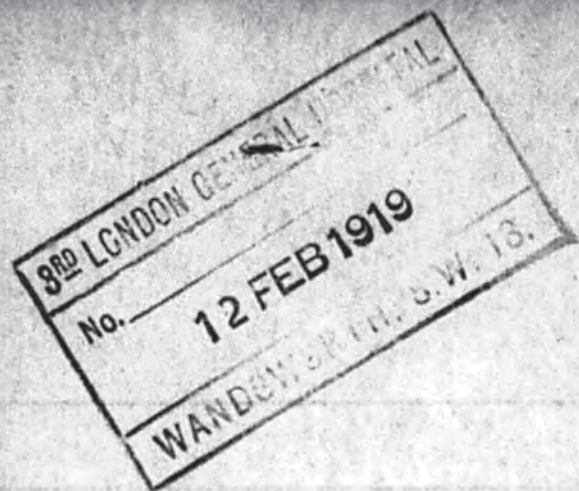


