Notes—(i.) 

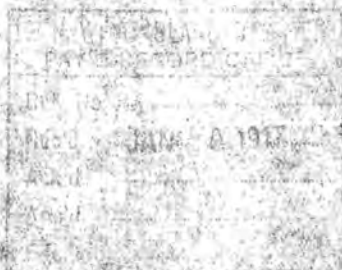


